### 4. First aid measures

**4.1 Description of first-aid measures****General advice**

Immediate medical attention is required. If symptoms persist, call a physician.

**Eye contact**

Immediate medical attention is required. Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15 minutes. Keep eye wide open while rinsing. Do not rub affected area. Immediately flush with plenty of water. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at least 15 minutes. If symptoms persist, call a physician.

**Skin contact**

Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water. Remove all contaminated clothes and shoes. Immediate medical attention is required. Wash off immediately with soap and plenty of water. Consult a physician if necessary. Immediate medical attention is not required. If skin irritation persists, call a physician.

**Inhalation**

Move to fresh air. Call a physician or poison control center immediately. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. Consult a physician. Immediate medical attention is not required. If symptoms persist, call a physician. Move to fresh air in case of accidental inhalation of vapors or decomposition products. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen.

**Ingestion**

Do NOT induce vomiting. Drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Immediate medical attention is required. Clean mouth with water and drink afterwards plenty of water. Consult a physician. Remove from exposure, lie down. Call a physician or poison control center immediately.

#### **4.3 Recommendations for immediate medical care and/or special treatment**

**Notes to physician** Product is a corrosive material. Use of gastric lavage or emesis is contraindicated. Possible perforation of stomach or esophagus should be investigated. Do not give chemical antidotes. Asphyxia from glottal edema may occur. Marked decrease in blood pressure may occur with moist rales, frothy sputum, and high pulse pressure. Treat symptomatically.

### **6. Accidental Release Measures**

#### **6.1 Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures**

Use personal protective equipment. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Evacuate personnel to safe areas. Remove all sources of ignition. Keep people away from and upwind of spill/leak. Pay attention to flashback. Take precautionary measures against static discharges.

**Methods for Containment** Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so.

**Methods for cleaning up** Take up mechanically and collect in suitable container for disposal. Dike far ahead of liquid spill for later disposal. Soak up with inert absorbent material. Clean contaminated surface thoroughly. Prevent product from entering drains. Dam up. Pick up and transfer to properly labeled containers. Take precautionary measures against static discharges. After cleaning,

flush away traces with water.

## 7. Handling and storage

### 7.1 Precautions for safe handling

#### Advice on safe handling

Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Wear personal protective equipment. Ensure adequate ventilation. Use only in area provided with appropriate exhaust ventilation. To avoid ignition of vapors by static electricity discharge, all metal parts of the equipment must be grounded. Keep away from heat, sparks and open flame. No smoking. Do not breathe vapors or spray mist. Take necessary action to avoid static electricity discharge (which might cause ignition of organic vapors). Avoid contact with skin and eyes. In case of insufficient ventilation, wear suitable respiratory equipment. Handle product only in closed system or provide appropriate exhaust ventilation at machinery.

#### Hygiene measures

When using, do not eat, drink or smoke. Remove and wash contaminated clothing before re-use. Provide regular cleaning of equipment, work area and clothing.
